At GLM, we are dedicated to empowering youth to become the next generation of leaders by equipping them with skills and resources to make a positive and lasting impact in their lives. Over the past year, we have served more youth, expanded our programs, and increased new partnerships.

In 2023, we achieved:

- 1. Implemented our first I AM ME Leadership Program as an after school program at Seven Hills Neighborhood Houses in the West End.
- 2. Increased our reach by 11.42% from 2023.
- 3. Raised over \$42,000, the most to date, at our 6th Annual Igniting Future Leaders Gala.

Our plans for 2024 include:

- 1. Develop long-term corporate partnerships for more sustainable programs.
- 2. Expand our mentor and after-school program to reach more youth.
- 3. Build local partnerships and collaborations with organizations that share similar missions to help increase our impact and reach.

We look forward to continuing our work in 2024 by impacting more lives as we empower more youth toward a brighter future. 2024 will be a year of reflection as we celebrate 10 years of service. As we work to make a positive impact on our youth and the community, we are grateful for the support from all of you, our staff, community partners, donors, board members, volunteers, program participants, and friends. Mission, Vision, & History

OUR MISSION:

Empowering young people to become the next generation of leaders by equipping them with skills and resources to make a positive and lasting impact in their lives.

OUR VISION:

OUR HISTORY:

Guiding Light Mentoring was founded in 2014 by CEO Latisha Owens. Ms. Owens felt a calling from God to provide youth with guidance, support, and encouragement in making positive decisions that would lead to a successful life. In her obedience to God, Ms. Owens started the business with just 5 mentors and 5 mentees and no budget. Ms. Owens believed so strongly in her calling, she used her own money to initially fund the organization. Relationships built through Guiding Light Mentoring have been proven as a key factor in the healthy development of youth.

OUR CORE VALUES:

These core values reflect a deep commitment to the holistic development of youth, building strong relationships, fostering a sense of community, and upholding ethical principles. They highlight the organization's dedication to creating a positive and empowering environment for young individuals in the Greater Cincinnati area.

- 1. **Compassion:** Demonstrating care, compassion, and commitment to young individuals.
- 2. **Hope:** Fostering hope and inspiring youth to achieve their goals and potential.

Programs & Services



Our Youth Education Program increases the number of under-served youth through community-based education and mentee-mentor relationships with a focus on job readiness and improving family dynamics.

Our Youth Wellness Program is dedicated to improving the health of youth with a priority on social, cultural, and emotional intelligence of youth. Youth are exposed to activities of arts/crafts, group outings, dance and sports. Integrated into this program are elements of self-preservation and self-worth.

Our I AM ME Summer Leadership Program is committed to creating future leaders. The five-week leadership summer program supports youth by establishing 3 key principles: Growing Talent/Developing Oneself, Collaboration, and Making a Difference.

Our I AM ME Summer Leadership After-School Program operates around the Cincinnati Public Schools calendar teaching students social emotional learning.

Our Youth Tutoring Program provides youth weekly assistance with their educational needs. We do this by empowering youth to confidently lead positive, productive lives.

Project E.P.I.C. (Endless Possibilities Influencing Changes is a 12-week program that addresses gun violence among youth in the community. The program is designed to help individuals shine, fostering leadership and personal growth through unique workshops and activities.

Scholarship Recipient

Lexie Fuson is a program participant and is Guiding Light Mentoring's 2023 Tasha Jones Porter Scholarship Recipient. Lexie's life started off a little rough, and because of that, she moved in with her grandparents at the age of 4.





The **6th Annual Igniting Future Leaders Gala** is Guiding Light's largest annual fundraising event honoring individuals for their outstanding commitment to young people. This special night celebrates and spotlights the outstanding work of our young people and the success they have achieved in our programs and services.

On October 28, 2023, Guiding Light Mentoring held their 5th Annual Igniting Future Leaders Gala at The Graduate Hotel where we hosted **135 guests**. Vice Mayor Jan-Michele Lemon Kearney was our keynote speaker who delivered a powerful message about perseverance and resilience.

Our emcee for the evening was local news personality Mikhayla Hughes-Shaw. We featured a seated dinner, an awards and scholarship ceremony, and a silent and live auction. We raised over **\$40,000** from the Igniting Future Leaders Gala in which the funds went towards supporting young people in the various programs and services we offer.

Northside Back-to-School Event

Over the spring, **United Way of Greater Cincinnati** launched their annual back-to-school supply drive called Backpacks for Success! Their goal was to collect **1,500 backpacks** with school supplies, so students have the tools they need to start the 2023-2024 year off prepared. The backpacks were distributed at three community Back-To-School events including a partnership with Guiding Light Mentoring.

On Saturday, Aug. 12 from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m., Guiding Light Mentoring and Chase Elementary School partnered to host their annual free Northside Back-to-School Event at McKie Recreation Center in the Northside Community. The event provided over **600 families** with items for the upcoming school year. Families received backpacks with school supplies, personal hygiene items, haircuts, uniforms, literacy kits and more.

Additionally, we had **16 vendors/community partners** present to share with the students and families resources available to them.

Organizations such as United Way of Greater Cincinnati, Cincy Smiles, TriHealth Mobile Mammography Van, and many others participated as well.

Leaders from the event hoped the event would bring the Northside community together while preparing youth for the upcoming school year, despite any financial difficulties.








I've learned that having a mentee is a blast! In all seriousness, it has taught me the two-way value of mentorship. It's not just the mentee who benefits positively.




